Welcome to all coaches, athletes, officials and spectators. Thank you to GNS for helping us out with field space.

Note: GNS Turf – All games at GNS will be on a turf field. Please let your athletes know that they are not allowed to wear screw in studs, eat, or chew gum on the turf fields.

1. Wenman Pavilion will serve as the tournament headquarters (located just off the main entrance of the school).
2. Three fields will be used in the competition. Two fields are located at the SMUS Senior School campus at 3400 Richmond Road in Victoria. One field is located at Glenlyon Norfolk, Pemberton Woods Campus (801 Bank St.). Each field will have a site coordinator. Change rooms and washrooms will be accessible at SMUS and GNS. The changing areas will NOT be locked, and teams are responsible for their own equipment and valuables.
3. The tournament entry fee is **\$175**. Please make cheque(s) payable to SMUS Athletics.
4. Athletic trainers will be located at the SMUS and GNS fields during both days of competition. Ice and emergency supplies will be available but please bring supplies such as tape and pro-wrap if athletes need taping etc...
5. A school nurse will also be available for the competition. She is located at the SMUS campus in the Health Centre.
6. Referees will be supplied by the local Association. Each team must supply a competent linesman as required for each match in which it takes part. Assistant referees will be supplied for the two medal matches.
7. The first team listed in the tournament matches will be considered the home team and must supply a suitable game ball. All teams should have either a back-up set of jerseys or a set of bibs for circumstances where there is a uniform clash. The home teams will wear alternate colours.
8. There will be a brief presentation ceremony at the conclusion of competition. Individual medals will be presented to the top three placed teams. An ISA Championship trophy will be presented to the winning team.

Tournament Format

1. The competition will feature two pools of 5 teams.
2. Teams will be placed in Red and Blue pools randomly, bearing in mind geographical location.
3. The designations 1-5 do not imply seeding
4. Teams will play round robin within their pools.
5. At the end of pool play, the two first place teams will play for the gold/silver medal, the second place teams for the bronze.

Tournament Rules

1. All matches will be 2 x 30 minutes in length.
2. Three points for a win, one point for a tie, zero points for a loss.
3. Any match that ends in a tie will go immediately to a FIFA penalty shootout, in order to determine a winner. The results of the penalty shootout will be used only to break a tie if those two teams are tied in point totals after round robin play. Both teams receive one point for the tie.
4. Group tie breaking procedure: If two or more teams are tied within a group and have an equal number of points on the completion of the round robin, the following criteria shall be used, in order, to determine the final standings

a) Two Teams Tied

Previous Match Result

The winner of the match between two teams tied in points shall be awarded the higher position – See penalty shootout above (point 3)

b) Three Teams Tied

i) Goal Difference - in the matches between the tied teams

Goal difference shall be calculated by subtracting Goals conceded from Goals scored. A maximum of five (5) goals shall be awarded in each game. [Example: a 5 – 0 score (5 goal difference), a 7 – 1 score (5 goal difference), a 7 – 3 score (4 goal difference).]

ii) Most Goals For - in the matches between the tied teams

If goal difference does not break the tie between the teams then the team with the highest goals for in the games between the tied teams will be given the higher ranking.

iii) Least Goals Against – in all the pool matches

The team having the fewer number of goals against in all matches will be awarded the higher position.

iv) Penalty Kicks

If two or more teams are still tied under criteria (i) – (iii), then the higher standings shall be decided by further penalty shootouts.
